

SJSM MEDICAL DOCTOR/ CERTIFICATE (MD/CERT) OR MASTER OF PUBLIC HEALTH (MD/MPH)

Certificate Admissions Requirements SJSM Certificate (MD/CERT) in Public Health Admissions Requirements

In partnership with the University of Nebraska Medical Center (UNMC), **St. James Medical Schools (MD)** students may pursue a Certificate in Public Health. MD students must apply for the certificate program in the first year of their MD enrollment and will complete the certificate during the first two years of the MD program.

The 15-credit hour certificate will allow MD students to gain basic skills and knowledge in public health to better address the health needs of individuals and populations. The certificate is awarded by UNMC. All applications, admission, course registration, and awarding of certificate are coordinated through UNMC.

MD students that would like to apply for the Certificate in Public Health must receive approval from their respective MD program.

To apply for the certificate program, all materials must be received by the application deadline of November 1.

Admission requirements are:

- Completion of the SOPHAS Express Public Health application (<https://sophasexpress.liaisoncas.com/applicant-ux/#/login>) and submission of the application fee
- Official transcripts reflecting an earned bachelor's degree and all transcripts from previously attended institutions
- *All non-US transcripts must be evaluated by the World Education Service (WES) using their ICAP Course-by course evaluation service*
- Letters of Recommendation
 - One letter must be from a designated MD program representative. Contact the admissions office for more details.
- A one-page resume/cv
- A one-page personal statement
- All applicants whose primary language is not English or whose undergraduate degree is from a college or university outside of the United States are required to submit official Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) scores.

MPH Admissions Requirements SJSM Master of Public Health (MD/MPH) Admissions Requirements

St. James Medical Schools (MD) students enrolled in the Certificate of Public Health program may choose to pursue the Master of Public Health degree program at the University of Nebraska Medical Center (UNMC). The dual degree program allows MD students to complete both the MD and MPH degrees in four years.

The MD-MPH dual degree program prepares students to better understand and address health issues on a population level and expand job opportunities. Career options for MD-MPH students are wide-ranging.

Students can pursue an MPH in all concentration areas offered as online options in the MPH degree. The 15 credit hours from the Certificate in Public Health and up to 9 credit hours (depending on concentration) from the MD program will apply toward the MPH degree. All credit hours applied to the MPH program must meet minimum standards for transfer credit and satisfactory academic progress. The MPH degree program is awarded by UNMC. All applications, admission, course registration, and awarding of MPH degree is coordinated through UNMC.

To apply into the MPH degree program, MD students must complete the certificate program and submit their application in their second year of medical school by June 1 or October 1.

Admission requirements are:

- Completion of the SOPHAS Express Public Health application (<https://sophasexpress.liaisoncas.com/applicant-ux/#/login>) and submission of the application fee
- Official transcripts reflecting an earned bachelor's degree and all transcripts from previously attended institutions
- *All non-US transcripts must be evaluated by the World Education Service (WES) using their ICAP Course-by course evaluation service*
- Letters of recommendation
 - One letter must be from a designated MD program representative. Contact the admissions office for more details.
- A one-page resume/cv
- A one-page personal statement
- *This requirement is waived for applicants that have successfully completed the Certificate in Public Health and two years of the MD program.* All applicants whose primary language is not English or whose undergraduate degree is from a college or university outside of the United States are required to submit official Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) score.

Curriculum

Students can choose from any of the seven MPH concentration options and must complete all core and concentration courses in the MPH program.

Students complete all requirements for CPH 528 Applied Practice Experience and CPH 529 Capstone.

Six credit hours from the courses below transfer from the MD program toward the MPH program to count as elective course credit: IMF4 for 6 credit hours
